3. Section 14.9: Taylor's formula for functions of 2 variables can be summarized as

$$\begin{aligned} f(x_0 + \Delta x, y_0 + \Delta y) &= f(x_0, y_0) + \sum_{k=1}^n \frac{1}{k!} \left(\Delta x \partial_x + \Delta y \partial_y \right)^k f(x_0, y_0) \\ &\quad + \frac{1}{(n+1)!} \left(\Delta x \partial_x + \Delta y \partial_y \right)^{n+1} f(x_0 + c\Delta x, y_0 + c\Delta y), \quad 0 < c < 1. \end{aligned}$$

Derive a similar formula for functions of 3 variables.
